<b>Job Purpose:</b>	<p>We are looking to recruit an experienced and talented Programme Manager: Conflict Sensitivity (PM) to manage and coordinate the effective and efficient implementation, monitoring, evaluation and reporting of MA-UK Myanmar's new programme entitled Reducing vulnerabilities, building skills and bolstering local capacities for sustainable peace through multi-ethnic community-based Friendship Centers in central and northern Rakhine State. This cutting-edge new programme, funded by UNOP's 'Lives with Dignity' facility and implemented in partnership with four community-based organisations, will deliver an integrated livelihood, WASH, social cohesion, climate change, DRR response, and research initiative to bolster the resilience of multi-ethnic, displacement-affected communities across six townships in central and northern Rakhine State.</p> <p>The Programme Manager (PM) will be the main focal point for this programme and will guide the implementation of all activities. Specifically, the PM will bring technical expertise and extensive knowledge of the Myanmar context to ensure that conflict sensitivity and do-no-harm principles are integrated into all activities and approaches within the programme. The PM will be designated to monitor and ensure trust and safe participation amongst communities targeted by the programme, particularly marginalised groups (such as the Rohingya, persons living with disabilities and women). The PM will also convene all Technical Working Groups. He/she will be responsible for coordinating with local authorities, clusters, and the larger humanitarian community to ensure the smooth day-to-day running of the programme activities.</p>
